The weekly reading schedule will overlap Sundays so if you like to read before you come to services on Sunday morning you won't have to wait to get the bulletin to do your reading. Following this schedule will take through the Old Testament (not including Psalms) one time and the New Testament and Psalms twice. There will also be a weekly "Reading Challenge" for those who want to read at a more challenging - and more rewarding - pace. Also, if you are following the reading schedule then you'll notice that the Sunday lessons and Wednesday devotionals are also following the reading schedule. Each week's lessons will come from a passage selected from that week's reading.

Reading Challenge:

Instead of reading the daily Proverbs above, read a whole chapter every day. January has 31 days, so you will read Proverbs through by the end of January. Next month you can either return to the scheduled reading for Proverbs or continue the practice of reading a chapter a day and read Proverbs through twelve times in 2018. Just read the same chapter of Proverbs for the corresponding day of the month, finishing what's left on the last day of the short months. Just think how much wiser you'll be by the end of every month!
